

FULL SUTTON AND SKIRPENBECK PARISH COUNCIL

The minutes of the Meeting of the Full Sutton and Skirpenbeck Parish Council held at Bugthorpe War Memorial Institute at 7.30 pm Thursday 16th December 2010.

Open Forum

No members of the public were present.

1. **Present:** The Chairman Councillor R Nightingale and Councillors R Westmoreland, E Keam, S Parkinson, M Dale, E Price and C Collier. Apologies for absence were received from Councillor G Ellis.
2. The minutes of the Full Sutton and Skirpenbeck Parish Council meeting held on 18th November 2010 were confirmed. Matters arising there from to be dealt with under the relevant heading of the Agenda as the Agenda is progressed.
3. **Declaration of Interest.** There were no declarations of interest made by those present in respect to items on the agenda.
4. **East Riding Items of Interest.** Councillor Dee Sharpe was unable to attend the meeting due to the weather; the Clerk will forward the minutes and actions points onto her.
5. **Planning.** There were no matters for discussion.
6. **Finance.** Payment was authorised on the following account:
 - Bugthorpe War Memorial Institute - Hire charge December - £12.00.
 - K Robinson - Clerk salary October - December 2010 - £616.86
 - K Robinson - Clerk expenses October - December 2010 - £63.70
 - Green Vale Gardens - Grass Cutting final cut for 2010 - £40.00
 - HSBA new account. The Clerk passed around an application form to open an account for the donations received for the play area. The account can have a maximum of seven signatories; those present completed the form.
 - Parish Council Insurance. The Clerk completed two applications for quotations for new insurance; the premium for Zurich was in excess of £700 however AON, who are the preferred supplier for NALC, will insure for £206.50. Councillor Keam proposed that the AON proposal be accepted, this was seconded by Councillor Price and the proposal carried.
7. **Highways and Footways.**
 - Speeding and road signage in Full Sutton. The Clerk met with Councillors Keam and Parkinson to look at ways to tackle the issue of speeding in Full Sutton and the inadequate road signage. Councillor Parkinson has drafted a letter which will be taken to all houses in the village along with a petition. Householders will be asked to sign these if they are in agreement and then this will be sent to the Overview and Scrutiny Officer. Whilst the Parish Council understand that ERYC are looking to cut costs steps do need to be taken. It is proposed that the speed limit be reduced gradually on the three approaches to Full Sutton and the signage for A166 be moved and made more visible. The Clerk will ask Councillor Sharpe to help raise the profile of Parish Council at County level. All present were in favour.
 - Stones in Full Sutton. Councillor Rudd has contacted the Clerk further to a telephone conversation with Rev'd Finnemore who is concerned about the stones on the grass leading to the church. Councillor Keam has spoken to ERYC who confirmed that the area in question is registered village green and therefore under the guardianship of the Parish Council. The placing of rocks by an individual without approval could be regarded as an interference with the public's legal right of access to the whole area. In addition should there be a third party insurance claim involving an accident with the rocks a magistrate could take the view that the party that placed the obstruction
