The Minutes of the Meeting of Full Sutton & Skirpenbeck Parish Council held in the Training Centre, HMP Full Sutton at 7.00pm on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> February 21<sup>st</sup> 2019.

### **OPEN FORUM**

There were 8 members of the public present. Among them were Kevin Heath representing Catton Parish Council and Dean Hodgson (Mayor) representing Pocklington Town Council.

A resident asked if the Planning Committee meeting was still going ahead on the 7<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and if anyone was due to speak at the meeting. She also asked how the meeting between Stephen Hunt, FSPC, SBPC and Ward Cllr Strangeway went. PK reported that he had been informed at the meeting that morning that the Planning Committee meeting has now been postponed until 28<sup>th</sup> March at the earliest or 18<sup>th</sup> April. A resident of Full Sutton has volunteered to speak at the committee, two Wolds Weighton Ward Councillors are on the Planning Committee so cannot speak on the resident's behalf, Ward Councillor Andy Burton will speak providing he is not called to sit on the Planning Committee. As only one resident is allowed to speak it is important that as many people as possible attend the meeting to show the strength of feeling against it. The deadline for objections has been extended to the 25<sup>th</sup> February. PK and RM attended a meeting at Beverley that morning called by CLLR Strangeway to 'clarify some misunderstandings', FSPC had been unaware that there were any. PK had asked how ERYC dealt with clear errors in submissions by developers, ERYC would go back to the developer and ask them to explain, that explanation would then be added to the Portal for further feedback. PK had asked to see the ERYC transport consultants report as soon as possible to ensure they had picked up the relevant points. ERYC are having to employ agency staff because of the number of objections being received as they all need to be checked and personal information redacted before being scanned and put on the portal. Numbers of objections are still the way to go to show the sheer weight of public opinion.

The objection to the Full Sutton development is far greater pro rata to that of the development in Port Talbot, objections such as the fact that it is in totally the wrong place need to be brought to the attention of the MOJ instead of ERYC.

A resident was very concerned that the development would affect the conservation area for frogs, toads and newts. The constant light would affect the wildlife habitats, in turn affecting the buzzards, bats and other wildlife in the area. She asked if there been a study into this? PK responded that there is an ecological assessment on the portal and if the resident thought this was incorrect could she submit an objection stating why.

Pocklington Town Council and Catton Parish Council have submitted objections and are encouraging residents to object if they so wish. DH stated that many people he speaks to think that the development is just an extension to the original prison. Could residents and Cllrs write to the Pocklington Post to explain that it is not an extension but a whole new Category C prison.

There is also a worry about a crime rise in the area (which is well documented around Category C prisons) and a rise in 'County Lines'.

PK thanked everyone for attending and also thanked the members of the public including AA for all the hard work in getting all the information out to the wider public. AA explained about the 'Sea of Faces' idea to have photos of the public up on boards at the Planning Committee meeting, there is a flyer explaining all about it due out shortly. The Public Forum closed at 7.29.

The meeting started at 7.30pm.

1. **Present:** Chairman Cllr P Kite, Vice Chairman Cllr A Davies and Cllrs A Aikman, S Barnes, P Beard, S Davies, R Milling and the Clerk. There were no Apologies.
2. **Code of Conduct.**
  - a) To receive Declarations of Interest from members of the Council on matters relating to the Agenda. All Cllrs had pecuniary interest in item 6b.
  - b) To note the granting of any dispensations to members of the Council on matters relating to the Agenda. The Clerk had issued Dispensations to all Cllrs.
3. The Minutes of the extraordinary Full Sutton & Skirpenbeck Parish Council meeting held on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> January 2019 were confirmed as a true record. PB proposed, RM seconded and all agreed. The Minutes were duly signed.
4. There were no Ward Cllrs present.
5. **Clerk Update.**

The Clerk updated the Councillors on the following:

  - a) Responsible Financial Officer Training held at Bishop Burton College on the 5<sup>th</sup> February was very useful.
  - b) NALC has agreed a Salary Award which will be on the next Agenda to be agreed.
  - c) Notice of Decision 18/04043/PLF: Erection of a single storey extension to rear (revised scheme of 18/02723/PLF). Location: Maiden Cottage, West Croft Farm, Main Street, Skirpenbeck, YO41 1HF. Applicant Mr N Stephens. Permission granted. The applicants had passed on their thanks to the Parish Council for their support.
  - d) Local elections will be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May, Clerk had forwarded all the forms to Councillors, deadline for submission to Beverley by 4.00pm on 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2019. Clerk to go to Beverley on the 27<sup>th</sup> March, Cllrs to drop forms off for delivery before the 26<sup>th</sup> March.
6. **Planning.**
  - a) Strategic Outline Planning Permission 18/04105/STOUT: Erection of prison complex with associated perimeter fencing, access, parking, landscaping and infrastructure (access and scale to be considered). Location: land to the west of HM Prison Full Sutton, Moor Lane, Full Sutton, YO41 1PS. Applicant: The Secretary of State for Justice. Deadline – 23<sup>rd</sup> January extended to 25<sup>th</sup> February.

PK reported that the meeting in Beverley attended by himself and RM was very productive from FSSPC's point of view. It was confirmed that FSSPC had been objecting with the correct material considerations, infrastructure, size, landscape, access, visual impact and sustainable development. They also confirmed that the volume of objections would count.

The Cllrs discussed the response put forward by the Planning Consultant, it was felt that on the whole it was excellent but the wording needed to be strengthened slightly to leave no doubt that the Parish Council objected to the first application and still objects to this one. PK proposed that SB revise the submission slightly and circulate for approval before sending back to the Planning Consultant who will then submit the objection on the Parish Council's behalf. AD seconded and all agreed.

AA had drafted a communication to the Planning Committee, Clerk to take a look and forward to Councillors for approval. The letter from Sir Greg Knight was discussed, AD proposed he draft a response to GK, to be copied to the MOJ and Rory Stuart, Minister for Prisons PB seconded and all agreed. To be circulated to Cllrs for approval. The Clerk asked if everyone could forward receipts and invoices of expenses incurred so far for payment at the next meeting. The Clerk can then ascertain if there is any money left in the Section 137 funds that the Parish Council could give out as grants to the groups organising leaflet drops/protests etc.
7. **Finance.** AA proposed the following should be approved including extra hours for Clerk, SB seconded and all agreed.
  - a) C M Miles-Findlay – Wages
