The Minutes of the Meeting of Full Sutton & Skirpenbeck Parish Council held in the Training Centre, HMP Full Sutton at 7.00pm on Monday 18<sup>th</sup> March 2019.

### **OPEN FORUM**

There were 7 members of the public present including Peter Hemmerman of the Yorkshire Party and Town Cllr for Market Weighton and Leo Hammond of the Conservative Party and Parish Cllr for Yapham cum Meltonby Parish Council. Both are standing in the forthcoming Ward Councillor elections for the Wolds Weighton Ward.

A resident asked if the Planning Committee date had been set yet, whether there was a final draft of an objection yet from the Planning Consultant and whether fundraising needed to be thought about. The Clerk reported that the Planning Committee was unlikely to be before the elections to be held on the 2<sup>nd</sup> May. Residents would like to go to the Planning Committee but need to know the date, Clerk to chase this up. PK stated that the PC still wanted to organise transport for those attending the Planning Committee. The Planning Consultant had completed his report and it had been accepted by the PC. Clerk to enter it onto the Planning Portal. The resident reported that there was a third Party right of way over the MOJ land that had not been reported in the Application. Residents were concerned that although there were now many objections on the Planning Portal (1493) some seemed to be missing. PK reported that the Planning Department have employed extra staff just to deal with the objections. A resident stated that it would be useful to know the stats of who is objecting and from where as this would be a powerful message at the Planning Committee but this is a huge task to undertake.

PH explained his reasons for standing in the Ward Councillor elections and stated that he had a pre-disposition against the Prison Application and had sent in his own objection citing lack of adequate roads and public transport, fear of crime and size of buildings being seen for miles around. He also stated that when the MOJ approached Local Authorities with a view to building new prisons ERYC welcomed it.

A resident had consulted with a Planning Lawyer and stated that there should have been an EIA study, archaeological reports were not sufficient, rights of way have not been considered, transport survey is flawed. She suggested that a Planning Lawyer would need to be employed if the plans are approved, she also suggested hiring Transport and Ecology Consultants. PK stated that although the PC pointed out the flaws in the first application ERYC did nothing about it. They have however completed their own transport assessment this time.

LH explained his reasons for standing in the Ward Councillor elections stating that he had asked Yapham PC for their support in objecting to the Prison application and had a pre-disposition against the prison and had sent his own personal objection. He asked if the PC had any other concerns, PK replied that ERYC officers don't listen to the PC's requests/concerns. This seems to be the same for many PC's.

Finally, a resident asked what the next steps are in the fight against the prison. The mega prison group proposed writing to all of the prospective Ward Cllrs asking what their views are on the prison application. A list of candidates will be released on the 4<sup>th</sup> April. Momentum is growing but how can this be sustained, can more PC's be approached to support a collective objection. Crowd funding was discussed and will be put on the next Agenda. PK thanked everyone for attending and closed the Open Forum at 7.42pm

The meeting started at 7.44pm.

1. **Present:** Chairman Cllr P Kite and Cllrs S Barnes, P Beard, S Davies, R Milling and the Clerk. Apologies received from Vice Chairman Cllr A Davies and Cllr A Aikman.

**2. Code of Conduct.**

3. The Minutes of the Full Sutton & Skirpenbeck Parish Council meeting held on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2019 were confirmed as a true record. PB proposed, RM seconded and all agreed. The Minutes were duly signed.

4. There were no Ward Cllrs present.

**5. Clerk Update.**

The Clerk updated the Councillors as the meeting progressed.

**6. Planning.**

- a) Strategic Outline Planning Permission 18/04105/STOUT: Erection of prison complex with associated perimeter fencing, access, parking, landscaping and infrastructure (access and scale to be considered). Location: land to the west of HM Prison Full Sutton, Moor Lane, Full Sutton, YO41 1PS. Applicant: The Secretary of State for Justice. Deadline passed but objections can be sent in up to a few days before the Planning Committee meeting. The No Mega Prison group would like to organise a meeting for the 4<sup>th</sup> April at the Training Centre, the Clerk cannot be present but PK and SD agreed to attend. Clerk to book room. Following a suggestion in the Open Forum PK to draft a letter to Parish Council's in the wider area asking for their support in a collective objection. SD to dig up quotes from MOJ in the Media and circulate to Cllrs. SB to draft a letter to the MOJ challenging any points they have made and circulate to Cllrs. Long discussion regarding Crowd funding, to be put on the Agenda for the next meeting for a fully informed debate to be voted on. AA had drafted a communication to the Planning Committee, Clerk had updated it and will circulate to Cllrs for approval.
- b) Listed Building Consent 19/00391/PLB: Installation of two rooflights. Location: Grange House, Hatkill Lane, Full Sutton, YO41 1HN. Applicant: Mr J Britton. Deadline 11<sup>th</sup> March 2019. Clerk had commented 'No objections' on the Planning Portal as instructed by Councillors.
- c) Full Planning Permission 19/00629/PLF: Internal and external alterations including erection of single storey extension to side, erection of a detached double garage. Location: 1 Bleach Farm Cottages, Roman Road, Stamford Bridge YO41 1SA. Applicant: Mr Sellers. Deadline 19<sup>th</sup> March 2019. PK proposed that the PC should recommend approval, SB seconded and all agreed.
- d) Notice of decision 19/00100/VAR: variation of condition 10 (approved plans) of planning permission 17/03206/PLF to allow alterations to the design of Plot 1. Location: The Paddocks, Hatkill Lane, Full Sutton, YO41 1HW. Applicants: Mr & Mrs L & S Bellion. Permission granted. Noted.
- e) Full Planning Permission 19/00298/PLF: Erection of single-story extension to rear following demolition of existing porch and store room. Location: Jasmine Cottage, Hatkill Lane, Full Sutton, YO41 1HW. Applicant: Mr Craig Cooper. Deadline 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2019. SB proposed that the PC should recommend approval, RM seconded and all agreed.

7. **Finance.** RM proposed the following be approved including Clerk's extra hours, PB seconded and all agreed.
